What is the World's Best Workforce?

The World's Best Workforce bill was passed in 2013 to ensure every school district in the state is making strides to increase student performance.

Each district must develop a plan that addresses the following five goals:

- All children are ready for school.
- All third-graders can read at grade level.
- All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
- All students are ready for career and college.
- All students graduate from high school.

All Children are Ready for School **2018-2019 Goal**

• In the Fall 2018, 60%* of kindergarten students met fall Kindergarten literacy benchmarks as measured by the FASTBRIDGE earlyReading composite benchmark assessment. In 2019, we will increase the number of students meeting fall K benchmarks by 7 percentage points to 67%*.

^{*} Adjusted data & goal: Fastbridge released revised norms & benchmarks in July of 2019. Under time of test norms, 45% of kindergarten students met fall Kindergarten literacy benchmarks, and the goal for fall 2019 was 52%.

• In the FALL 2019, 59% of kindergarten students met fall Kindergarten literacy benchmarks as measured by the FASTBRIDGE earlyReading composite benchmark assessment. In 2020, we will increase the number of students meeting fall K benchmarks by 5 percentage points to 64%.


All Third-Graders can Read at Grade Level **2018-2019 Goal**

 The percentage of all students in grade 3 at OPS who are proficient on the MCA III Reading Assessment will increase from 54% in 2018 to 61% in 2019.
